PASTOR'S DESK

We read, "It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. The stone had been moved...'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb,' she said" (Jn. 20:1,2).

We should be careful not to misunderstand this matter of the empty tomb on Easter Morning. When Jesus' disciples first discovered the empty tomb, it was not good news. It was bad news because they thought that Jesus' tomb had been desecrated. Their Lord's dead body was gone. It was still dark when this discovery was made, and we can only imagine how desperately they longed for the light of dawn to break.

And then it came! Gloriously, the morning came! Bright and beautiful it came -- filled with the Resurrection Power of God -- filled with the loving Presence of God. And Mary Magdalene, who had loved Jesus so intensely, was the first person to experience the wonder of that day.

One by one the disciples began to experience the Presence of the Risen Lord. But that was only the beginning. Before the day was over, the disciples who had shared in the experience of having Jesus back alive with them, began to see it as more than an Event. It was also a symbol. God was saying something through the Event. The Event was a message to them from God -- a revelation! And the message was that the Lord God Almighty, who created us out of His great Love, is always acting with Resurrection Power -- to bring healing out of sickness, joy out of sorrow, life out of death. The Resurrection Power of God, always and everywhere, is telling us that our suffering is not without meaning, that with death comes a new beginning, that we will rise with Jesus to sing a new "Halleluiah" refrain.
